# Tokamachi City Garbage Disposal Guidebook

Put waste in the right place!



Valid beginning April 1st, 2022.

Three simple things to remember:

- 1. Separate your trash.
- 2. Dispose of your trash on the designated day by 8:30am.
- 3. Make sure your trash is in the **designated trash station** for your neighborhood.

This guidebook only applies to individual residences and households (NOT companies, stores, or other business institutions) and as such, businesses are not permitted to use residential trash stations. Businesses are responsible for the disposal of their own waste and should bring it to the garbage incinerator by themselves or consult with a licensed general waste facility.

# **How Tokamachi City is Decreasing Its Carbon Footprint**

#### O Understand the 3 Rs!

#### **Reduce**

- Buy only as much as needed
- Instead of accepting plastic bags when doing your shopping, use a tote or eco bag!
- Use refill packages when available (like shampoo, conditioner, laundry soap, etc) instead of buying new plastic bottles each time
- Decrease your food loss



#### Reuse

- Get as much use out of one item as possible
- Consign or resell your old things instead of throwing them



#### Recycle

- Properly separate your trash and recyclables
- Take advantage of supermarket recycling programs
- Buy recyclable products
- Compost food scraps and yard waste



#### Don't throw away your toothbrush!

Tokamachi City accepts used household toothbrushes. This includes toothbrushes used for general cleaning (like floors and bathtubs) as well, but make sure they have been well-rinsed before you bring them in.

Please note we cannot accept single-use toothbrushes, dental floss, interdental brushes, electric toothbrushes, toothbrushes made with natural hair (such as pig, or soft brushes)

# How can I reduce my food waste?

### O Cut down your organic trash

Use it all up: don't waste any of it!

Check your refrigerator before you go grocery shopping, properly store whatever you buy, make sure your fridge is well organized, and consume everything that is edible.

#### Eat it all: don't let that deliciousness go to waste

Don't prepare more than you or your household will be able to eat. Arrange the leftovers for another menu. Understand the difference between "best by" dates and "expiry" dates. Order only as much as you can eat when you go out for meals.

#### Drain the water out: organic waste is heavy with it!

Did you know organic waste is made of about 80% water? Make sure to squeeze it all out or drain it before throwing it away.

#### What's the difference between a "best by" date and an "expiry" date?

**Best by date:** This means the food still tastes fine, so long as the packaging has not been opened, and it has been stored properly in a temperature-controlled environment. So even if the date has passed, you can probably still eat it. Use your best judgment – does it look safe, does it smell okay, etc.

**Expiry date:** This means the food is still safe to eat, so long as the packaging has not been opened, and it has been stored properly in a temperature-controlled environment. If the date has passed, however, you probably should not eat it.

# **Climate Change**

### What is climate change?

The atmosphere surrounding the Earth contains greenhouse gases like carbon dioxide and methane. These gases trap the sun's heat to keep our Earth a comfortable temperature to live, and without them it's thought that our temperatures could go as low as -18 degrees Celsius or 0 degrees Fahrenheit.

However, too much of these gases and the Earth's temperature will warm beyond these comfortable limits.

In recent years the Earth's average temperature has steadily increased. At this rate, not only will the sea levels will rise from glacier melt and the extreme weather occur more frequently, but we will also see influences from this increase in the collapse of the ecosystem, the food-supply crisis, and an increase of infection and diseases, just to name a few.

The cause of these greenhouse gases increasing stems from the convenient and comfortable lifestyle we all lead. The more convenient our lives are, the more carbon dioxide is emitted. By reevaluating the way we live and reducing our amount of waste, we can reduce carbon dioxide emissions and therefore reduce our burden on the environment.

In response to the global crisis that threatens the survival of the human race, each and every one of us must now take action.

In June 2020, Tokamachi City announced that it would work to achieve becoming a "Zero Carbon City in 2050." "Zero carbon" is achieved when combining both the reduced human CO2 emissions and the amount naturally absorbed by forests and other parts of the environment.

### Take action now for the future.

Tokamachi City approves of the National Movement "COOL CHOICE" as a measure against climate change.



# **Unlawful Dumping / Trash Burning**

Unlawful dumping and illegal burning of your trash are prohibited by law.

Doing so will risk your arrest, which carries a maximum 5-year prison sentence and/or a fine of no more than 10 million yen. (The fine is increased up to 300 million yen for corporations.)







#### **Unlawful Dumping and Littering Is a Crime!**

Throwing your household trash anywhere but your designated neighborhood trash area is known as "unlawful dumping."

Littering of your PET bottles, empty cans or glass bottles, and cigarette butts also falls under this umbrella.

Not only are you harming the beauty of our environment, you are also contaminating our rivers and pipes.

If we receive a tip about you doing this, we will investigate the scene and notify the police if you are found to be the perpetrator.

Cameras are installed in areas that are known to have been used often for unlawful dumping.

#### Trash Burning is Prohibited by Law

Burning your own trash in a field is prohibited by law.

The smoke and odor of wildfires can cause problems and deteriorate the surrounding living environment. Additionally, the dioxins and other harmful chemicals produced by the fumes can have adverse effects on your health, pollute the air, and the fire can easily begin to rage out of control.

#### **Exceptions to the Burn Law**

\* Just because an example is on this list does not give you free rein to burn carelessly. Please take all necessary precautions and pay careful attention to wind conditions.

If your fire prompts complaints from surrounding residents, we ask that you stop burning immediately.

#### The following five examples are exceptions to the burn law:

- When local and federal governments need to conduct a controlled burn for building maintenance
- During disaster preparation (such as earthquakes, damaging winds, floods, fires, etc) when burning materials is necessary for emergency prevention or recovery
- Religious events or other customs calling for the burn of related materials
- When incineration is necessary for to agriculture, forestry, or fishing industries
- Minor incineration of waste normally used in daily life, including bonfires

# Rules for Disposing of Trash in Tokamachi City

#### O How to dispose

Please make sure to properly separate your trash.

Properly separate and sort

Dispose of at the appropriate date and time

Dispose of at the appropriate *location* 

Use the city-designated bags for **Burnables** and **Landfill**. Make sure to tie up the flaps.

Have your trash out by 8:30am the day it is meant to be picked up.

- We cannot guarantee pick-up after this time.
- Weather and road conditions may cause our drivers to be late. If your trash station still has not been cleared by 4:30pm, call the Tokamachi City Environmental Department at 025-752-3924.

There are trash stations located in each neighborhood explicitly for the use of said neighborhood. Do not dispose of your trash in a different station. Neighborhood residents are responsible for the upkeep of their trash stations. Please make sure your trash station is tidy and, in winter months, shoveled.




Length must be within 50cm


#### **Exceptions:**

- Skis, snowboards (landfill trash)
- Bicycles (metal types)

#### **Size Limits for Eco Clean Center**

Length must be within 200cm





Width must be within 90cm

### O Why do we need to separate our trash?

- Non-burnable items that have made their way into the incinerator are typically the cause of mechanical failures, which costs huge amounts of money to fix.
- When metal items have gone into the incinerator, toxic substances have been detected in the resulting ash, which then requires chemical treatment.

# What should I do if I find a notice posted to my trash?

If you discover a notice posted to the trash you put out, simply follow the instructions written, fix any mistakes, and put out your trash again on the appropriate day.

#### It will look something like this:



#### O Common Mistakes


- Landfill garbage that did not fit in the bag had a "medium" or "small" designated bag, instead of a "large" designated bag.
- Non-burnable items (glass, aluminum cans, etc) were mixed in with the burnables.
- > The trash hasn't been properly sorted.

#### **Examples:**

- 1. Cosmetic containers were put out with the other glass containers. (They should be in landfill!)
- 2. Items from both Paper Groups A and B were mixed together.

### **Burnable or Landfill?**

If you are uncertain where your trash should go, this flowchart will help. This chart applies ONLY to trash that is soiled or cannot otherwise be cleaned.



### **Types of Waste**

- 1. General Waste: disposed of by the city or other professional.
  - A) **Residential Waste:** waste produced from use in daily life by households. Includes burnables, landfill, and recyclables.
    - ① To be disposed of at your local trash station by 8:30am either in a designated city bag or the baskets for recyclables located within the station.
    - ② OR to be disposed of at city sanitation, known as the Eco Clean Center. Must be taken in person. To be used when your amount of trash is too big or too much for your local trash station. 【P27~P34】
    - ③ If you have trash that cannot be disposed of by the city, please consult with a specialist or other professional, such as the store it was originally purchased from. See below this outline for a detailed list.
  - B) **Business Waste:** waste produced by businesses. Does not include industrial factories/businesses.
    - 1 To be outsourced to a city-licensed contractor.
    - ② OR to be disposed of at city sanitation in person. CANNOT be disposed of in neighborhood trash stations.
    - ③ Industrial recyclables (paper, aluminum, plastic, glass bottles, etc.) cannot be disposed of by the city.
- 2. <u>Industrial Waste:</u> pertains to 20 types of waste designated by law that is generated by business activities.
  - A) Waste types designated by industry
    - ① Paper scraps, wood scraps, fiber/textile scraps, animal/plant waste (all types)
  - B) Waste types without designation
    - ① Cinders/burnt residue, sludge/slime, acid waste, alkaline waste, plastics, rubber, aluminum, glass, concrete scraps, porcelain/ceramic scraps, ore, rubble, dust/soot, any industrial waste processed for disposal

#### [Industrial Waste Disposable by the City]

(From "Enforcement of the Tokamachi City Ordinance on Waste Disposal and Cleaning," excerpt from Article 3)

Industrial waste generated within the city's general waste disposal plan area that can be easily disposed of together with general waste, whose properties do not affect the disposal facilities, and whose quantity does not interfere with the disposal of general waste, as well as other waste specifically approved by the mayor. (Examples: paper, wood, and textile scraps)

#### Waste the City Can't Dispose (Please note this is not an all-inclusive list.)

- The "Big 4" appliances: televisions, refrigerators/freezers, clothes washers/dryers, and heating/air conditioning wall or ceiling units
- Toxic items: agricultural chemicals (pesticides, etc), poisons, industrial chemicals, chemical substances
- Dangerous or potentially combustible items: gunpowder, cylinders containing propane or other harmful gases, fire extinguishers,
   gasoline, diesel fuel, kerosene, fuel oil, etc
- Complex items (requests can be made with a specialist [P35]):
  - > Items considerably large in weight or size: pianos, fireproof safes, garden stones, stone lanterns, etc
  - > Items of a complex difficulty to process: rubber tires, car parts, lead batteries, combustion residue, fertilizers, etc
  - > Large agricultural equipment: tillers, tractors, rice-harvesting machines, greenhouses, etc
  - > Heavy equipment: construction/machine tools, woodworking appliances, textile appliances, food processing machinery, etc
  - > Business and store items: vending machines, display racks, showcases, etc
  - > Others: dyes, raw industrial materials, manufacturing materials, production facility equipment, raw produce (includes agricultural produce)

### **Burnable Waste**

**How to dispose:** Put your trash in the appropriate city-designated bag and tie up the flaps. Please don't overfill the bag so the trash overflows so much you cannot tie it. Leave in your neighborhood's local trash station.

#### When it won't fit in even the largest bag:

If the item is within size limits (tallest/longest part within 120cm or diameter within 50cm, and no heavier than 30kg), then take a large city trash bag (marked with the kanji 大) and either tie it around the item or attach it to the item so that it can be seen.





# ► CAUTION!!!! <</p>

- Does not pertain to business establishments.
- Make sure to drain all excess water from any organic waste. (Organic waste contains roughly 80% water.)
- Do not *completely* cover up the contents of your trash so they cannot be seen.
  - Usage of non-transparent bags interferes with processing as the trash collectors cannot see the contents easily enough. We request that you not use rice bags, fertilizer bags, or any bags that are not clear. However, having part of your trash in one of these bags inside of the designated city bag is allowed.
- Burnable bags containing non-burnable items (such as cans or bottles) will not be collected.
   Uncollectable trash will have a notice posted to it, and you will be expected to correct your mistake and put out your trash again on the appropriate day.

#### **Examples of Burnable Items**

#### **Organic Waste**

- Food scraps
- Tea leaves
- Fruit skins
- Grease/oil (use a paper towel or cloth to wipe it up)



#### **Wood Scraps**

- Wooden products (like trays)
- Disposable chopsticks
- Bamboo skewers (if applicable, please cut off the pointed sharp end or wrap it in paper for safety reasons)



#### **Paper Products**

- Paper diapers
- Paper scraps
- Tissues
- Rice bags
- Carbon paper
- Receipts
- Soiled/smelly items that cannot otherwise be recycled



### **Burnable Waste**

#### Accepted Items:

#### **Clothing & Fabrics**

• Old Clothing ● Curtains ● Towels Carpets • Stuffed Toys Cushions etc.



- X Please cut large items into 60cm. If you can't cut it, you can bring it to the Eco Clean Center.
- ★ Used clothing can be taken free of charge to the recyclable collection center. [P33]

#### **Leather & Rubber Items**

- Bags● Wallets Shoes
- Gloves Rubber Sheets
- Hoses Balls (sports, etc)



XPlease cut large items into 60cm. If you can't cut it, you can bring it to the Eco Clean Center.

#### Pruned Branches, Bamboo,

#### & Wooden Items

(must be within 120cm length) If the diameter of the bundle is within 50cm, you can also put it out by wrapping it up with the designated large bag.

W Up to 5 bundles at a time



#### **Household Medical Waste**

- Intravenous Bags
   Stoma Bags
- Catheters etc.

XOnly items made of plastic. For metal parts such as needles, ask a medical institution to dispose of them.



#### Others

- Ice Packs(including Ice Pillows) Deoxidants
- Desiccants Disposable Heat Packs
- Plastic items that cannot be put out as recyclables
- Agricultural Mulch Sheets, agricultural vinyl (Limited to home gardens) (Up to 1 medium designated bag

[P35 for 2 or more bags] ) ● Cat litter (Put in a ● Fireworks, Gunpowder, etc. (douse with water) transparent or translucent bag to prevent spillage)

- Aluminum Foil Aluminum Plates
- Ash (briquettes, bean charcoal, charcoal etc.) (Check that there is no active burning or smoldering and put in a transparent or translucent bag to prevent spillage)
- Agricultural Chemicals, Fertilizer Containers Limited to home gardens (bags, bottles, boxes, etc. Fertilizer bags limited to 10 bags.) • Bleach (chlorine) Containers



- Blue Sheets (Up to 1 medium designated bag, cut into pieces of about 60 cm. If you can't cut it, you can bring it to the Eco Clean Center.)
- Grass, Fallen Leaves (up to 5 large bags)
- Golf Bags (take out the golf club!)

#### Items That Cannot Be Put Out With Burnables

- Incombustible items
- Dangerous and Harmful Substances (disposable lighters, items containing mercury, batteries, individual gas cannisters)



### **Landfill Waste**

**How to dispose:** Put your trash in the appropriate city-designated bag and tie up the flaps. Please don't overfill the bag so the trash overflows so much you cannot tie it. Leave in your neighborhood's local trash station.

#### When it won't fit in the designated bag:

If the item is within size limits (tallest/longest part within 120cm or diameter within 50cm, and no heavier than 30kg), then take a large city trash bag (marked with the kanji  $\,\pm$ ) and either tie it around the item or attach it to the item so that it can be seen. Skis and snowboards are exempt from size limits.

- Fishing rods Golf Clubs
- Kotatsu Top PlatesHoes, Shovels
- Skis Snowboards etc.



Please bring items that exceed the size limit to the Eco Clean Center or ask a licensed company to collect and dispose of them. However, if the longest part exceeds 200cm and the width exceeds 90cm, the city cannot handle it. [P29]

#### X Items With Unremovable Batteries

Products with built-in batteries should be individually placed in the designated bag, and marked with "B" on the bag.

- Electric Toothbrushes Electric Razors
- Smartphones
   Tablets
   etc.
- ※ Some small household appliances are collected free of charge as resources. 
  【P31】





#### **Dangerous and Toxic Items**

Do not put items that may catch fire or explode or contain harmful substances in the designated bag, but put them in a transparent or translucent bag according to types.

Fluorescent light bulbs can be damaged, so wrap them in newspaper or other paper, or put them in a transparent or translucent bag.

- Disposable Lighters (please use up the gas)
- Batteries (dry cell batteries, button batteries, lithium batteries)
- Rechargeable Batteries Fluorescent Lights
- Products containing mercury such as mercury thermometers or blood pressure monitoring cuffs











### **Landfill Waste**

Size limits: Length within 120cm, Diameter within 50cm, Weight within 30kg



#### O If your trash sticks out of the designated bag...

We will still collect your trash if about 80% of the item fits inside the bag. Please secure the bag flaps tightly so the item doesn't fall out.

(Examples: umbrellas or snow brushes)

# ► CAUTION!!!! <</p>

- Does not pertain to business establishments.
- If there are any items inside that may tear the designated bag, put them in a transparent bag or wrap them in paper before putting it in the bag.
- Do not *completely* cover up the contents of your trash so they cannot be seen.
  - Usage of non-transparent bags interferes with processing as the trash collectors cannot see the contents easily enough. We request that you not use rice bags, fertilizer bags, or any bags that are not clear. However, having part of your trash in one of these bags inside of the designated city bag is allowed.
- Landfill bags containing non-landfill trash will not be collected. Uncollectable trash will have a notice posted to it, and you will be expected to correct your mistake and put out your trash again on the appropriate day.

#### **Accepted Items:**

#### **Glass Items**

Cups • Mirrors • Tempered (heat resistant) Glass • Glass Plates • Light Bulbs, Glow Starters, Night-light Bulbs,
 LED Bulbs etc.

(Fluorescent lamps, which are mercury-containing products, are dangerous and harmful substances.) [P11]



#### **Ceramics/Pottery**

• Plates • Bowls • Flower Pots etc.



#### **Electric Appliances**

- Rice Cookers Printers Microwave Ovens Electric Fans Radios Vacuum
   Cleaners Irons Lighting Equipment Oven Toasters Cassette Decks ●
   Dehumidifiers (Other than Freon products) [P14]
- Heaters (Electric Stoves and Ceramic Heaters) etc. (Certain heaters, like oil stoves, fan heaters, and oil heaters are made of metals and should be disposed of on that day.)
- Some small household appliances can be collected free of charge. [P31]
   If the rechargeable built-in battery can be removed, please remove it. If it cannot be removed, please refer to "Items With Unremovable Batteries" [P11].



#### Items made of multiple materials such as metal, plastic and wood

(please disassemble and separate items into their respective categories when possible)

#### **Blades**

- Kitchen Knives ◆Scissors
- Knives Razors etc.



#### **Carpentry/Construction Tools**

- Saws Hammers Planes
- Screwdrivers etc.



#### **Agricultural Tools**

- Scoops, sickles
- Trowels Hoes etc.



#### **Kitchen Utensils**

- Ladles Spatulas Slicers
- Graters etc.




#### **Others**

- Plastic tanks for kerosene etc. Bathtub Covers
- Magnets Weighted Pickling Stones (storebought)
- Beverage Lids (energy drinks, canned coffee, etc.)
- Nails, Bolts, Nuts, Pushpins, Safety Pins
- Plastics (items that cannot be cleaned or have deteriorated)
- Pump Type Nozzles, Spray Nozzles etc. (because these include metal parts)



- Toys (excludes cloth and wooden items) CDs/DVDs
- Video Tapes Cassette Tapes Umbrellas
- USBs and SD Cards (or similar)



- Bicycle tires/tubes Pushcart tires/tubes
- Unicycle tires (full wheels are also acceptable)



# **Landfill Waste**

#### **NOT Accepted Items:**

#### Natural Objects

- Stones Soil Mud Sand
- X These are not waste and cannot be disposed of by the city.



#### **Household Medical Waste Needles**

- Syringes with the needle Intravenous Needles
- Butterfly needles
- X Consult with a medical institution for disposal.



#### **Concrete Items**

- Concrete, mortar, or cement rubble Bricks
- Concrete Blocks

\*\*These cannot be collected at neighborhood garbage stations, but you can bring them to the Eco Clean Center to dispose of them. (Disposal costs are required.)

Please refer to P29 for quantity.



#### **Electric Home Appliances (The Big 4)**

- TVs Air Conditioners Refrigerators, Freezers
- Washing Machines and Dryers [P36]



#### **Items With Freon**

• Freons are enclosed in the products listed as "R", "CFC", and "HFC" at the beginning of the explanation of the refrigerant method. Ask a professional vendor for processing. • Includes dehumidifiers etc. [P35]



### **Papers**

#### O How to dispose

Please tie them together according to type and put them out at your local garbage station.

# ► CAUTION!!!! <

- Does not pertain to business establishments.
- Please use a paper string to tie together if possible.
- Please sort papers based on types (newspaper, cardboard, paper cartons, etc.) and tie them up respectively with the string. (If it is not divided into types or if the classification is incorrect, it will not be collected.)
- If you don't know the type, please put it out as burnable garbage.
- If it is includes any gold or silver components (including characters etc.), please dispose of it as **Burnable**.
- Please be sure to remove all other materials (vinyl, plastic, etc.). Small staples used to bind magazines or other publications are fine to leave in, but remove any thick, industrial staples if applicable.
- If you are not sure whether the paper is part of Group A or Group B, please put it out as *Other Papers* in Group B.

#### **Accepted Items in Paper Group A:**

#### Newspapers, Flyers, City Newsletters

Does not include any newsletters bound with staples or glue. (The Tokamachi City newsletter does not contain either.)

※ Please tie these all into one pile.



#### Cardboard

Do a quick check of the cardboard to see if it is fluted like in the cross-section diagram below. Thinner cardboard also contain this.






← Some cardboard have this special recycling mark on them.

#### Drink Cartons (does not include ones with silver lining inside)

- \* Remove any plastic part from the nozzle/spout area. This goes into Burnables (see photo below).
- ※ Cartons in this category will be marked with a symbol that reads 紙パック (kamipakku).
- ※ Any cartons marked with only a paper recycling mark (紙) should go to Burnables.







### **Papers**

#### **Accepted Items in Paper Group B:**

#### Magazines, Books

Those containing staples or glue binding



#### **Paper Boxes**

 Paper boxes (containing no gold/silver lining) ● Toilet paper cores ● Plastic/aluminum wrap cores

※ If the core of the plastic wrap is too hard to be crushed or flattened out, tie it up with the rest of the pile as is.



#### **Other Papers**

- Wrapping Papers
   Envelopes
   Calendars
   Memo Pads
   Copier/printer papers
   etc.
- X Smaller paper items should be placed between larger ones.
- Notebooks and notepads bound with wire should be disposed of as Group B if they can be disassembled, or as burnable garbage if they cannot be disassembled.
- ※ If the paper is in a plastic bag or other bag, please remove the bag.
- ※ If the envelope has a window, please remove regardless of the material of the window.

#### NOT Accepted Items in Paper Group B (put in Burnable):

- Paper with unremovable metal parts Paper that contained pesticides, fertilizers and chemicals ●
   Smelly or soiled paper items (Cake and pizza boxes, detergent, incense sticks, soap boxes, etc.) Paper containing plastic, cloth, gold/silver lining, etc ●
   Receipt papers Carbon paper ●Paper rice bags ●
   Yogurt containers and ice cream containers
- ※ If you don't know what it is, put it in burnables.
- ※ Any unaffected parts can be grouped in Paper B as usual.






# **Plastic (PET) Bottles**

#### O How to dispose

Remove the cap and label, then put in your local garbage station's bins for disposal. (The label and cap go in Plastics.)



# ► CAUTION!!!! <</p>

- Does not pertain to business establishments.
- Wash and allow to dry as thoroughly as possible so that nothing is left in the bottle.
- Parts that are difficult to remove from the bottle may be left on. This includes handles on larger bottles, inner caps (like soy sauce bottles), the plastic ring around drink bottles, paper labels that won't completely come off, etc.







# **Plastic (PET) Bottles**

#### **Accepted Items**

• Bottles that contained food, beverages, or medicine and have the PET recycling mark on them





#### **NOT Accepted Items**

- Bottles that ontained pesticides, fertilizers, chemicals, and fuel (Please dispose of them in burnables)
- Items that do not have the PET recycling mark on them (Please dispose of them in plastics.)
- Dirty items (Please dispose of them in burnables.)



# Why remove the cap and label from the plastic bottle?

PET bottles themselves, caps, and labels are made of different materials, so they are recycled separately.

Remove the caps and labels and dispose of them in plastics so that they do not interfere with recycling.

- © The PET bottle itself is made of polyester, the same material used for shirts and food packaging.
- ► Clothing fibers and food packaging sheets can be made of recycled plastic bottles.
- © Caps and labels are made from various plastics such as polypropylene and polystyrene.
- ► These can be used as raw materials for plastic panels and as a fuel in a process called thermal recycling.


# **Items the City Cannot Process**






# **Tokamachi City Disposal Status**

#### **①** Waste Output Trends



The total waste output has decreased due to the declining population, but the waste output per person has remained almost unchanged. By reducing the waste output per person, the amount of waste discharged by the entire city can be significantly reduced.

#### 2 Waste Output by Category (2020)




Burnable waste accounts for about 3/4 of the amount of garbage discharged.

By working on reducing our output, each person can decrease the amount of garbage and therefore reduce the carbon dioxide generated by burning said garbage.

# **Tokamachi City Disposal Status**

#### 3 Expenses and income by processing category (2020)




Waste disposal costs more than 600 million yen annually.

Compared to a large amount of expenses, the income is about 150 million yen, which is less than 1/4 of the expenses.

#### **④** Comparison of recycling costs and sales of recyclable resources (2020)





Only a small portion of the cost of recycling can be recovered by selling resources.

In particular, PET bottles and plastics cost a lot of money to recycle, but we are collecting them as a measure against marine pollution and global warming.

In the future, efforts to reduce PET bottles and plastics (controlling the output of garbage) will be the most important.

# **Tokamachi City Disposal Status**

⑤ Plastics and papers contained in burnable garbage (newspapers, leaflets, etc.)

We conducted an examination into the amount of plastics and paper contained in Burnables.

- © The total amount of plastics contained in about 300kg of burnable garbage was about 15kg, or a ratio of about 5%. The total amount of paper was 29kg, or a ratio of about 9%.
- © Converting the total amount of burnable garbage discharged in one year to 13,121 tons (2020), this means that about 600 tons of plastics and about 1,100 tons of paper are incinerated.
- © For each citizen, about 12kg of plastics and about 22kg of paper are mixed in with 254kg of burnable garbage put out in one year.

"If you separate it, it can be recycled; if you mix it together, it is garbage."

Let's separate our waste properly and do right by the Earth.

Let's break it down further...

Plastics and paper contained in 13,121 tons of burnable garbage discharged in one year
